Further to your letter dated 02 June 2020 made under the Official Information Act 1982.

Specifically, you requested;

1. How many Neurologists do you have on staff? (Numbers and FTE equivalent) As at 31/03/2020

Waikato DHB is currently awaiting the arrival of a further Neurologist from overseas, which will bring the FTE to 6.4

2. How many Neurologists are Multiple Sclerosis Specialists on staff? (Numbers and FTE equivalent)

Two of the Waikato DHB clinicians are Multiple Sclerosis specialists.

- 3. How many Neurologists on your staff see patients with Multiple Sclerosis? All six doctors see Multiple Sclerosis patients.
- 4. How many Neurology Nurses do you have on staff? (Numbers and FTE equivalent)

Please note: Waikato DHB does not have a definitive classification in our database for "neurology nurses" however these are the numbers of nurses employed within a specialised neurology department.

Neurology patients are looked after by registered nurses if they are an inpatient at Waikato Hospital.

Most neurology patients are located on Ward OPR5 (this is an acute geriatric and neurology ward). On a morning and afternoon shift there are six registered nurses, and there are four registered nurses at night. There are also a number of health care assistants and one-to-one support if needed.

5. How many MS Nurse Specialists are on staff? (Numbers and FTE equivalent)

We have four neurology clinical nurse specialists (3 FTE). One of the clinical nurse specialists has lead oversight of Multiple Sclerosis patients, but all clinical nurse specialists support Multiple Sclerosis patient care and clinic infusions.

a) First specialist neurology outpatients' appointment?

Please note: The table above includes all Neurology first specialist appointments (FSA) between 1 April 2019 and 31 March 2020. Wait times are based on Elective Services Patient Flow Indicator (ESPI2) timeframes set by the Ministry of Health, where the first specialist appointment (FSA) should occur within 4 months of the acceptance of a referral. The wait time will depend on the triage of the referral (acute to non-urgent) rating. We aim see all FSA patients within the 4 month Ministry of Health timeframe.
