Grey Literature—

Literature not published by traditional or commercial publishers is termed grey literature. It can add important information to your literature search. However, it may not have gone through a rigorous review process so check quality and bias,

You won't necessarily find grey literature via our Library databases. Here's tips on how to find theses and government reports/policies:

Dissertations and theses

 <u>NZ Research</u>—search for dissertations/theses/research

Government documents

- Use Google advanced search (click on Tools in a Google search). Type "govt.nz" in the "site or domain search box. . specify the "site or domain" to limit the search to NZ government websites
- <u>Ministry of Health Manatū</u> <u>Hauora</u>—search for policies and publications

Bringing the voices of Māori to the fore

A study recently published in the New Zealand Medical Journal explored Māori experiences and perspectives of hospital treatment in the context of acute care.

The key needs highlighted by the small group of participants were "... the importance of whanaungatanga in building trusting relationships with patients and whānau; creating safe spaces for patients and whānau; improved staff cultural safety; exploring individual patient and whānau needs, avoiding assumptions about cultural requirements or stereotypical characteristics; upholding the mana of all patients with respectful interactions; and empowering Māori as partners in their care."


